Introduction

Air displays have taken place in Jersey for over 70 years. The first took place in 1933 at Le Quennevais and it has been an annual event at Jersey airport and over St Aubins Bay since 1952 (with two exceptions – the last during the COVID restrictions in 2020).

The Jersey International Air Display has become the Island's premier tourism event and is one of the highlights of the Island's calendar of events. It is watched in person and online by over 50,000 people. All Island children are given the day off school to attend the event and many employers give their employees the afternoon off work to watch the flying display as well. Many others utilize their holiday entitlement to attend.

As the largest free event in the Island, the Air Display is funded by private sponsorship and a small government grant. This means

that all families irrespective of their income can enjoy the flying display over St Aubin's Bay and activities on the Lower Park together.

The air display has been an international event since 1998 and in 2013 it was awarded the Paul Bowen trophy at the European Air Show Convention in Brussels as the best European air display in recognition amongst other things for the range of rare and unique aircraft that regularly take part. It is our intention to return the air display to its 2013 standard following three years of restrictions following the outbreak of COVID.

The event is organized by Jersey International Air Display a.r.l. It is a not-forprofit limited company whose objectives are to support Jersey tourism and various local charities:
